

2020 was a year of unprecedented challenges and upheaval. By God's grace our church has risen to the challenge and discovered new opportunities for ministry. In 2020 we:

- Invested over \$400,000 in COVID-19 relief
- Welcomed 216 new members
- Launched new ministries to single adults
- Ended the year with a financial surplus
- Received over \$1.1 million for the Christmas Offering

As we look ahead together as a church, our vision for 2021 is to reinforce the basics of our mission while discovering new ways to care for one another and our neighbors.

Sunday worship must continue to be our first priority with a multiplying impact on how our people think and live. We need to shorten our time horizon, deepen our relationship connections, and increase our communication.



ANSWER: We are financially healthy due to our church's generosity and our staff's careful stewardship. By the end of January, our fiscal year income surpassed our expenses by over \$1,900,000! This surplus was an important factor in our decision to return the Paycheck Protection Program funds and will provide us with much-needed margin for future ministry.

ANSWER: The proposed budget reflects our priorities for the coming fiscal year It includes a 3% (approximately \$300,000) decrease from our prior-year budget. Given the current economic uncertainly, we felt it wise to plan for a reduction in revenue.

NEXT DOOR MISSION UPDATES

QUESTION: Who is approving the College Park Church Greenwood and One Fellowship Church budgets?

ANSWER: The Lord continues to care for and provide for College Park Church Greenwood and One Fellowship Church in this season, and both congregations are doing very well. In the past twelve months, the College Park Church family approved healthy changes in our church planting process, specifically related to elder and congregational biblical self-governance for College Park Church Greenwood and One Fellowship Church.

The changes requested by the elders and approved by the congregations recognized that College Park Church Greenwood and One Fellowship Church are stable and the elders and congregations are ready and able to fully function as biblically self-governing churches. This recognition and change in status to biblical self-governance provides the elders and congregation of each church the ability to oversee all aspects of the church, including the responsibility to develop, approve, and fund the ministry budget for their individual church.
