## LESSON ONE

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### **READ & RESPOND:**

Read the account of the fall of humanity in Genesis 3 and answer the following questions.

1. According to Genesis 3:1-6, how did sin start? What kind of attitude did Adam and Eve have toward God?
2. What were the consequences of Adam and Eve's sin?
3. How does the sin of racism directly go against what God says in the Bible?
4. How does racism hurt people today?

### PRAYER POINTS:

- Pray that Jesus would help you see all people as worthy of dignity and respect because they are made in the image of God.
- Is there anybody you have a hard time showing kindness to because they are different than you? Ask the Lord to help you see that person the way he would have you see them—as someone loved by God.

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### **READ & RESPOND:**

Read 1 Cor. 15:20-23 and answer the following questions.

1. Who is the man who brought death in 1 Cor. 15:21? Who is the man who brought the resurrection of the dead?
2. How does Jesus's death pay the price for all our sins? What does that mean for your life and your sins?
3. How is Jesus's life, death, and resurrection the greatest reason for rejoicing that we could ever hear? How does it bring healing to the world—including people of every skin color?
4. What does it mean to "belong to Christ" as mentioned in verse 23? How can you live as somebody who belongs to Christ in the way you treat people of different skin colors and backgrounds?

## LESSON TWO - DISCUSSION

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### PRAYER POINTS:

- Pray that those in your family would continually turn to Jesus for forgiveness and restoration when they sin, knowing that Christ has already paid the price for sinners.
- Is there anyone you know who you'd like to share the good news of Jesus with? Ask God how you can tell them about Jesus. Pray for an opportunity to share this exciting news with them.

## LESSON THREE

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### **READ & RESPOND:**

Read the story of the prodigal son from Luke 15:11-32 and answer the following questions.

1. How does the father in Luke 15:20-24 seek reconciliation with his son?
2. In verses 18-21, what attitude does the son have when seeking reconciliation with his father?
3. What would it look like if the father and son had not reconciled?
4. Why might some people not want to seek reconciliation with people who are different from them?



### PRAYER POINTS:

- Pray that God would bring all Christians together in unity as one family in Jesus. Pray that God would change us and remove all forms of racism from our hearts.
- Has anyone in your life made you feel bad because you're different from them? Ask God to help you to forgive them and seek reconciliation with them. Ask your mom or dad for advice on how to respond when this person hurts you.
