Two Big Ideas

First, we are regularly tempted to be like the Judaizers and rely on our own efforts for self-justification rather than counting everything as loss in order to know Christ.

Second, we are called to **press on** in our walk with Christ.

In summary

It's not about us, it's all about Him.

Press on!

MINDSET

We should count all our spiritual and physical accomplishments as loss for the sake of knowing Christ.

MINDSET

Don't let looking good or doing good even for the sake of Christ be your goal. Your goal should be to know Christ, to gaze upon Him, and for your mind to be fully set on Him.

Paul calls the church at Philippi to “**press on** toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.”
