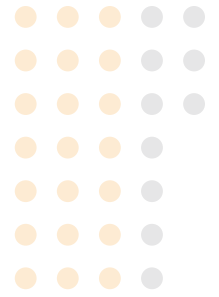

As we seek to further leverage the Parish Shepherding Model, the elders have recognized the need for ministry assistants, or parish deacons, to extend our reach in caring for the flock. We believe the use of deacons as assistants in compassion and shepherding care is faithful to the biblical teaching on the diaconate in 1 Timothy 3 as well as the apostolic precedent in Acts 6. PASTORAL TITLE CHANGE

CASTLETON

Castleton Congregation Self-Governance

The Castleton congregation has been approved by the Elder Council to come before all College Park congregations for a vote to become self-governing.

Self-governance means that College Park Castleton will be a local church with complete governing authority. Although College Park Castleton will be a separate, legal entity from College Park Church, it will continue to partner with the College Park Family of Churches within the Next Door Mission. As a self-governing church, College Park Castleton will be able to:

- Establish its own membership
- Form its own Elder Council
- Create governing documents such as Cody of Bylaws, Member Covenant, Membership Confession, and a Confession of Faith
- Incorporate as a 501(c)(3) entity

As a launched church of College Park Church (North Indy), College Park Castleton will continue to express the DNA of College Park Church in its unique context. Ministry coaching and relationships between the members of the College Park Family of Churches will continue to occur.

Outside of Next Door Mission-related initiatives that include church planting and voluntary ministry collaboration with the College Park Family of Churches, College Park Castleton will be fully devoted to the contextualization of ministry in Castleton and the surrounding community.

What is the plan for the name of the church in Castleton?

The congregation at Castleton has voted on a new name to assume upon congregational approval for self-governance. Provided the vote for self-governance is approved, the church will be self-governing as **Castleton Community Church** starting April 1, 2020.
