Joe & Meta Arthur - Brazil

Joe serves as professor and dean of the master's department of the Regular Baptist Seminary of Sao Paulo. He is also involved in weekend ministries of teaching and preaching. Meta serves in women's and children's ministries at the church and cares for their family at home.

Steve & Kelly Baughn - Japan

Steve and Kelly have served with TEAM in Japan since 1997. Currently, Steve acts as the Ministry Area Leader. The Baughns are an integral part of the Tokyo Metro Ministry Initiative, with which they work as church-planting ministry team members.

Brian & Lauri Dix - Portugal

Brian and Lauri serve with Horizon International Schools, a ministry of the Association of Baptists for World Evangelism which works to provide quality distance education courses to train workers for ministry around the world.

Jason & Megan Doddridge - North America

Jason and Megan worked with Japanese university students in Utsunomiya, Japan through an extracurricular club called B.E.S.T. (Bible, English, Sports, Travel). Their primary responsibilities were evangelism to the Japanese and establishing a local church in Utsunomiya. They are now on assignment with The Navigators in Indianapolis. They reach out to international students in central Indiana.

Chris & Michelle Hubbard - North America

Chris works with a team to develop specialized computer software for use by Bible translators and language workers worldwide. The goal is to allow faster, more accurate, and more meaningful Bible translations.

Tom & Robin Miyakawa Family - Thailand

Tom and Robin are focused on caring for missionaries in Chiang Mai, Thailand. Tom is a math teacher at Grace International School which serves over 350 missionary families and their 500 kids. Over 3,000 missionaries live in Chiang Mai and serve all over Southeast Asia.

Dan & Valerie Moulton - North America

Dan supports the reaching of various Native peoples of Canada by maintaining the airplanes utilized by the mission.

Justin & Heather O'Malley - New Zealand

Justin serves as New Zealand National Director of Cru ministries. Cru in New Zealand has six strategic ministries: Campus, Athletic, Military, Familylife, Workplace, and Church network. Justin provides leadership to these six ministries and oversees the training of New Zealand staff in communicating the gospel in these different ministries.

Peter & Areni Ritchie - Angola

Peter and Areni help with literacy development among the unreached Mumuila people, under the auspices of the church in Angola.

Brad & Gina Shaw - Peru

The Shaws are helping with church planting and leadership development among the La Union Quechua people of the Peruvian Andes mountains. The Shaws are also using health services and radio to pioneer a new work in a remote location. They lead a team of fellow Quechua workers, reaching into over 40 villages, 16 of which now have small fellowships.

Jim & Pam Tomasik - Ukraine (stateside residents)

Jim serves as the Director of Ukraine for the International School Project (ISP) and as a member of the ISP global leadership team. The goal of ISP is to bring the hope of Christ to students through their teachers.
