



5 aspects of Jesus's servanthood

- Served as a teacher
- Served by healing many
- Served whole-heartedly and Sacrificially
- Served knowing the will of His Master
- Served by exposing enemies of His Master

Jesus teaching in the Synagogue



1. Jesus served by being a teacher

- a. 1:21 he entered the synagogue and was teaching
- b. 3:1 and again He entered the synagogue
- c. 4:1 teach beside the sea (in parables)
- d. 6:1 he began to teach in the synagogue
- e. 10:1 ...went to Judea and again, as was his custom, he taught them

2. Jesus Served by Healing Many

- a. 1:23-26 man with an unclean spirit
- b. 1:29 heals Peter's mother
- c. 1:32-34 healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons
- d. 1:40 heals a leper
- e. 2:1 Heals a paralytic
- f. Raises a girl from the dead, a woman with a blood discharge, the demon possessed man from Gennesaret, the deaf and dumb man, the blind man, etc.

3. Jesus served whole-heartedly, even sacrificially

- a. Served when he must have been humanly tired Mark 6:31 "Then Jesus said, 'Let's go off by ourselves to a quiet place and rest awhile.'
- b. Served when he must have been hungry Mark 11:12 "And on the next day, when they had departed from Bethany, He became hungry."
- c. Served to the point of death on the cross Mark 15:37 " And Jesus uttered a loud cry, and breathed His last."

4. A servant knows the will of His Master

 Mark 1:35 "And in the early morning, while it was still dark, He arose and went out and departed to a lonely place, and was praying there.

 And in Mark 6:46 "And after he had taken leave of them, he went up on the mountain to pray.

5. Jesus, as a good servant was FOR His Master.

- He called out those who pretended to serve the Master, but were hindering His work and misleading people.
